

Aberdonian Glynn Geddie really knows how to live life in the fast lane.



The 20-year-old professional racing driver is now looking forward to the 2011 season with fresh vigour after penning an exclusive sponsorship deal with Allseas Global Logistics.

Glynn has also already been named as the British Racing Drivers' Club rising star in recognition of his achievements, an award previously bestowed upon Lewis Hamilton and Jenson Button.

But the added pressure of being mentioned in the same bracket as the Formula One greats hasn't unnerved the Granite City ace – in fact it's inspiring him to reach new grid glory.

The Allseas Global Logistics and Apex Tubulars backed driver has now waved the chequered flag on his first season as a professional racing driver in what was a largely successful campaign.

He'll spend his winter break slowing down slightly as he considers his options ahead of the new season but he's now in pole position with interest rising in his fledgling career.

Glynn finished fourth in the 2010 Porsche Carrera Cup with Team Parker Racing a considerable feat as he was up against seasoned professionals.

In the British GT Championships he finished second even though he missed the opening two rounds of the event but also helped to fire Trackspeed co-driver David Ashburn to title glory.

“I’ve been relatively pleased with the progress I’ve made in my first season as a professional driver particularly after stepping up a level,” said Glynn.

“I can’t help wondering if I might have been able to do a little bit better in certain races – I still go through incidents in fine details. You always have to analyse your own performance.

“But I know I’ve got a lot of hard work ahead of me in the future and I’m now looking to fine tune all my skills to make a real push for success.

“I’ve got a lot of big decisions to make over the next few months and I’ll take my time over it giving everything as much consideration as possible.

“It was a huge honour to win the award previously awarded to both Jenson and Lewis. I often get asked about following in their footsteps but I see my career moving in a different direction.

“However, even just being spoken about them in the same breath has really fired me up to be as successful as possible in my own career.

“It’s also great I’ve got such dedicated and interested sponsors behind me like Allseas Global Logistics it means a lot to me to know they are right behind me.”

Glynn also revealed he’s set himself a three year plan with the ultimate aim of competing in the world famous Le Mans 24 race and making his mark Stateside.

It might sound like a huge task but this young man has a bright future ahead of him so anything is possible.

He added: “It’s always been a real ambition of mine to compete at Le Mans and I’m hoping to reach a level where I’m good enough to do that.

“I’d also love to compete in the big races in America – it’s a huge task but one that I am fully focused on achieving.

“It would be great to develop my career in a totally new direction like that and I’m certain I’d learn new skills from competing abroad.”

While Glynn might be in a hurry to reach the top there’s no doubt he’s on the right road to success.
